Last update you may have seen a feature on the challenges we face in policing the Northern areas of North Somerset. Whilst they remain, it doesn't prevent some superb results occurring with both us and the wider team within our area. I wanted to share just a couple of those:

You may have seen on the front page of the North Somerset Times the closure of International Stores in Nailsea. This was a source of significant complaints and, thanks to the work with our fantastic licensing colleagues, the store has now ceased operation. It was possible thanks to the information from the public that we rely on to tackle crime and disorder issues, and followed a number of visits and enforcement activity against the location.

You'll also see on the next page how we have managed to identify and deal with a number of young people causing significant Anti-Social Behaviour issues in the Congresbury area. Within a week of escalating this increased issue, our PCSOs patrolling the area have identified the offenders and we are dealing with them positively.

One of the things I was asked about by a resident recently was about PCSOs; would I want just police officers in my team? And the answer for me here is 'no'...I want people who think. I want talented people who are committed to making a difference and have the capacity to make that difference. I can say with all honesty we have that within our team, superb staff who care and think about how to best respond to the issues that affect you... I am very proud of the team I lead and I hope as these updates progress you will be too.

Anti-Social Behaviour

We recently received complaints of escalating Anti-Social Behaviour issues in the Congresbury area – ASB can span a variety of complaints and as such we have many different views on how we should handle it. For this particular issue we had criminal offences and victims who were being routinely harassed such that they feared leaving their home. Taking this information, we sought to proactively target this group (through patrols and investigation). Within a week PCSOs Kate and Dan identified the group (with PCSO Julie's assistance), seizing items in their possession that were to be used against victims. We will be working with the youth offending service to make sure these instances do not happen again.

Grafitti

We have been working on graffiti issues in Nailsea and continue to do so. This has been a frustrating investigation however we hope to have updates soon. I am aware that there is a growing amount of public concern over this and I can only (at this stage) say we are working hard to identify the person or people responsible and we are hopeful of a positive update for you soon.

We are however very keen to receive any further information that leads to the apprehension of those tagging Nailsea. Whilst we have some leads to follow, our success is always only as good as the information we get from the community. Crime is a community issue, we as the police act within the community to deal them. But it is the community that is key. I assure you all reports will be treated seriously and investigated.

Concerns

There have been a number of things we have heard alleged in the community and social media, we wanted to clarify a couple of them:

'A boy was chased through Somerset Square by a man, wielding an axe, who is squatting in the old College building'

Not true. And there are no squatters.

'Shop windows were smashed the weekend of 4th March in Somerset Square by youths'

We received a call stating this. It was false. Officers attended the location and youths were present but causing no issues. The caller was then abusive to our call handler when we said we had attended.

If we can tell you, we will, so please ask us if you have concerns.

What do you know?

Our work is dependent on the community. When you hear about issues affecting your area, or when you are discussing issues in the area with your friends and family, what do you do about it?

Do you know of suspicious activity in the area? Know who's selling drugs? Know where stolen property goes? Know who's driving without a licence? Drink Drivers? Places selling under age alcohol?

There's all sorts of information we would want to know about and whilst some will always say 'isn't that your job' - our job is to receive information from the public to then act on it. International Stores was a success because of information from the public any activity we do needs the community. Issues are community issues, not policing issues, we only act on behalf of the community to help solve them. Which means you need to tell us.

If you want more information on intelligence, drugs or other things like crime prevention, we can hold 2-hour masterclasses for groups, or organise an open 2 hour event – all we need is the initial interest from a few and we will arrange – in fact shortly you'll see some we have just arranged to see if people will turn up... it worked well when we were in Weston...

Paperwork? Lots... but where do you want me?

There's a lot of paperwork being a Sergeant. Don't feel bad for me... please... I'll survive. Despite that, it's important I try to be as visible as possible – getting out is important to me as is limiting the amount of paperwork I have to do in work time (I do this update for example at home out of hours, mainly because I am so cool I write newsletters in my spare time). It's important you can see me and hold me to account on what my team is doing, or guide our activity through information. I go to meetings and groups, but it's also important I am just out and about in your area.

I get a lot of people we talk to saying they never see police officers. I can honestly say my team get out and about every shift. However, with 2 operational police officers and currently 7 PCSOs covering the area above, you may not always see them as they pass your area.

However, today in work I tried a new thing I want to keep doing. I took my office out of the office. We have a mobile police station and I have taken this out and about. I have to do my paperwork, but with staff reviews and investigation reviews to write up I did them in 3 different places:

- Felton
- Congresbury
- Nailsea (Mizzimead end)

I spent about an hour in each and in addition to doing my paperwork I spoke to 17 people about local issues. Whilst I know that's not perfect, I would have otherwise had 0 interactions as my paperwork took up my day in the actual office.
